Our incredible staff moved into our Suffolk service over Christmas and New Year to protect the people we support during a coronavirus outbreak.



Angela, FitzRoy Director of Operations, said:

“ We have seen this exceptional commitment throughout the pandemic, but to give up their Christmas and New Year and not be with their families.... well, we were blown away. ”

Deputy Manager Harry told us how he and three other staff gave up their family Christmases to support Richard, Thomas, Neil and Adam at our Bury St Edmunds supported living service.

Harry said: “Thankfully my staff were so committed, those of us who had tested negative moved into the service as soon as we could.

“My manager Christina was checking in on us multiple times a day, we had staff dropping off anything we needed and we had so much support from FitzRoy’s coronavirus response team. I couldn’t have asked to be better supported. It made us feel like we were all in it together.”

Senior support worker Egnés said: “We were confronted with a situation that could easily turn into a crisis. So when Harry asked ‘who is going to be in isolating with the people we support’ I jumped into action because I realised that my loyalty, commitment, values and beliefs were being put to the test more than they ever have been.”

We are always looking for new and creative ways to enable the people we support to live fulfilled lives. Lockdown has presented enormous difficulties but our staff are working hard to be creative and find new ways to keep the people we support engaged and interested.

Thanks to your support, we have been able to invest in seven Magic Table 360 projectors.

The Magic Table 360 is a fully interactive projector where images, games and lights are projected, and move and change when they are interacted with. This means the people we

support can play football, air hockey, go fishing, play a leaf-sweeping activity and a bubble bursting game, among many others.

Carrie Sant, our assistive technologist, said: "We recently had a Covid-19 outbreak at our Huw's nursing care home in Nottinghamshire. With all residents having to self-isolate in their rooms, the Magic Table 360 provided a perfect source of entertainment. The people we support were entirely absorbed by the colours, sounds and games.

"We couldn't have invested in this programme without our amazing supporters, so thank you for all of your support. Our dream is to buy more to share among our services so they can benefit even more people."

Natasha, service manager at The Pastures in Norfolk, said:

“ It is so versatile; the people we support have varying abilities and it really has created some wonderful moments for everyone. ”
